National Dog - The RingLEADER Way

The 2002 AKU – Purina All Breed Championship Show held on the 8th September, 2002 is the largest dog show in Malaysia. Kuala Lumpur the capital of Malaysia is the host of this event. The conformation show attracted an entry of 250 dogs and there were 34 entered in the Obedience Classes. Mr. Hideaki Nakazawa (Japan) judged the Pastoral, Hound and Working Groups as well as General Specials and Mr. M. Tashimo (Japan) was appointed to the Toy, Terrier, Gundog and Utility Groups as well as Minor Puppy (Sweepstakes). This was the only class open to Minor Puppies on the day.

There are roughly 10 – 12 shows per year in Malaysia and each of these are held in a different city. Therefore, campaigning a dog in Malaysia takes quite a bit of patience and perseverance. The catalogues were free and had quite a lot of explanatory information in them not just about the judges and committee of this particular show but also about the hobby of dog showing in general. To be awarded the title of Malaysian Champion a dog must have accumulated 36 points at Championship & Specialty Shows of the Malaysian Kennel Association. CC – 12 points, Res CC – 4 points, 3rd placing 2 points.

The catalogue also boasted a host of Prefixes from abroad. The Pastoral Group included Tiakina and Shelbrae Shetland Sheepdogs, Kerrybent Border Collies from NZ and several German Shepherds from Germany. In the hound group Teckeldow and Laen Dachshunds were exhibited along with several Australian imports amongst the strong Beagle contingent, including, Kinbrace, Nangunyah, Severu, Clarion, Tobarenny, Cambewarra and Doubloon. Likewise the numerically strong working group included Guntop Boxers, Kauriland Rottweilers and a Methusela St Bernard and several dogs, including Dobermans, imported from the United States. The Toy group is quite popular and boasts the largest variety of breeds. The Australian import AUS CH/MAL CH Starblaze Rodney was Runner UP in Group. The Gundog Group boasted an entry of 41 and included a Glenbriar Cocker Spaniel and a Driftway Lab. In the Utility group's largest breeds were Miniature Schnauzer and Shih Tzu and Australian influences in the Dalmatians with Gemcourt and Swiftgait kennels represented.

Ultimately Best In Show was awarded to the Malaysian bred German Shepherd, Winnerall Franco (Fonseka), Runner Up In Show was the Miniature Pinscher, TH/MAL GR CH Assaswin's Dollar of HanDynasty Imp. Thai (Elwin Khor) and Puppy in Show was awarded to the Standard Short Hair Dachshund, Hacienda Ewe Lil Beauty (Krishnan) *Sally Everist, an Australian living in Malaysia*
